For our annual Ruge Lecture, we are delighted to have Mark Hagopian.



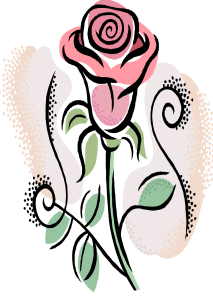
